Reminder: We have had a few cases of Chicken Pox in the last couple of weeks. Onset is 13-21 days after exposure. Small itchy, red spots appear first on the trunk, and then spread to the neck, scalp, face and the rest of the body. The spots form a water blister; it turns yellow, breaks open and scabs over. The child may be tired, have a sore throat and fever for the first few days. The child needs to stay home until the last blister crusts over (about 6-7 days). Do NOT use aspirin.
